Discussion intro

Christchurch Three Mills was planted without a church building. The film describes some of the ways in which the church has grown as a 'church without walls', with and in the community. With limited resources, this has involved great adaptability and creativity alongside a commitment to participation and developing local leaders. Their commitment to growing with the local community is reflected in the assertion that: 'We don't see ourselves as the ones with all the answers but we get to see where God is at work and join in'.

In the film, Reverend Dan Scott is honest about the challenges they have encountered and the value of growing slowly and taking a long term view, allowing their neighbours to see that Jesus is present in all circumstance of life, not just the easy bits. It's through this honesty and openness that people experience God's generosity, hospitality and love.

This outward focused, shared mission is reflected in Jesus words, often referred to as the Great Commission, as he sends his disciples out to share God's good news with the promise that he will be with them.
